Dear Paul,

I am writing to formally request the provision of 10 used horse shoes from the Horse Tram operations for the purpose of the 2019 Rock 'N' Roll Festival Top 10 Vehicle trophies.

The Rock 'N' Roll Festival, managed by the City of Victor Harbor, is held in Victor Harbor over a weekend in the middle of September each year. The event attracts over 10,000 people annually and includes vehicle displays of the era, with top vehicles awarded trophies including a Top 10 category.

For the past 10 years the Top 10 vehicle trophies have been made using horse shoes supplied by the Horse Drawn Tram under informal arrangements. Given the transition of the Horse Drawn Tram now operating under the Victor Harbor Horse Tram Authority, I write requesting the board consider this formal request for the supply of horse shoes for the 2019 event.

In exchange for the supply of 10 horse shoes, we would like to offer the Horse Tram a 3 x 3 display site on Warland Reserve as part of the 2019 Rock 'N' Roll Festival at no charge, and promotion of a discount offer for Festival attendees that you may wish to provide. For example; for the 2018 event the Horse Tram provided a 2-for-1 ticket offer for Rock 'N' Roll Festival official evening event ticket holders (approx 400 vouchers).

Please find attached a photo showing the horse shoe trophies in their final form.

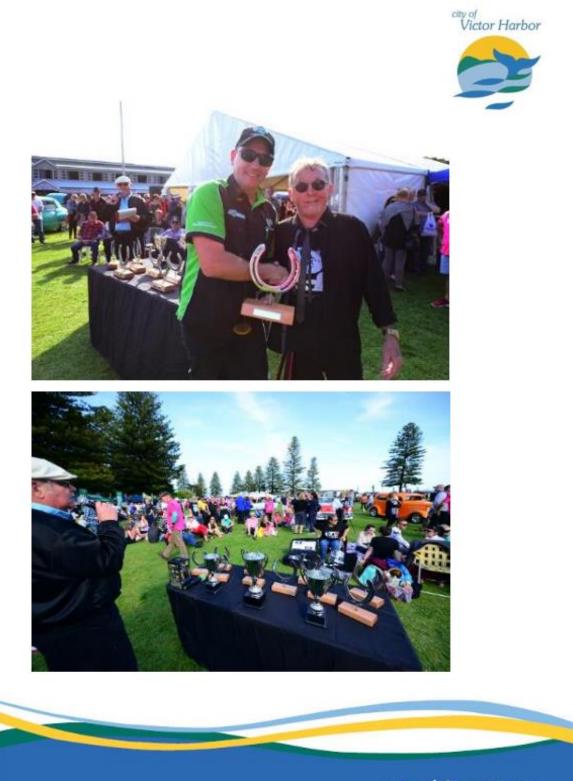

PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to seek approval from the City of Victor Harbor to utilise Council's Audit Committee until 25 October 2020.

RECOMMENDATION

- 1. That the Board receive and note the report on the Audit Committee.
- 2. That the Board seeks approval from the City of Victor Harbor to utilise Council's Audit Committee as the Audit Committee for the Victor Harbor Horse Tram Authority until 25 October 2020.

INFORMATION

The charter states the following:

- 4.1.1 The Authority is required to establish an Audit Committee and clause 13(4) of Schedule 2 of the Act governs the constitution and functions of the Audit Committee. The Authority may establish its own Audit Committee or use the Council's Audit Committee with the agreement of the Council.
- 4.1.2 If the Authority establishes its own Audit Committee:
 - 4.1.2.1 it must comply with the Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 2011 regarding the membership of the Audit Committee;

An officer(s) of the Council nominated by the Chief Executive Officer of the Council may attend Audit Committee meetings as an observer;

4.1.2.3 at least two members of the Audit committee must be neither elected members nor employees of the Council.

- 4.1.2.4 The presiding member of the Audit Committee must not be an elected member or employee of the Council;
- 4.1.2.5 members of the Audit Committee are not entitled to payment of Remuneration fees unless approved by the Council;
- 4.1.2.6 minutes of an Audit Committee Meeting must be provided to the Chief Executive Officer of the Council within five days of the Audit Committee meeting to which the minutes relate.

Utilisation of the City of Victor Harbor Audit Committee will enable the Horse Tram Authority to meet its requirements of it Charter and the Local Government Act 1999.

RISK ASSESSMENT

Governance – There are ongoing requirements for the City of Victor Harbor Administration to provide support to the Horse Tram Authority during its transition to independence. The utilisation of the skills and expertise of Council Audit Committee can also assist the Authority during this time. The risk is considered low.

Financial – The risk associated with the Authority deferring establishing its own Audit Committee until 25 October 2020 does not create any financial risk.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

If the Authority decides to establish its own Audit Committee, there will be additional, unbudgeted costs associated with setting up the committee, such as advertising costs, independent member sitting fees.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to consider the appointment process of an independent auditor of the Victor Harbor Horse Tram Authority.

RECOMMENDATION

- 1. That the Board receive and note the report on the Auditor.
- 2. That the Board seeks approval from the City of Victor Harbor to appoint the Council's External Auditor Galpins.

INFORMATION

The charter states the following:

- 3.3.1 The Authority must appoint an auditor, Subject to the Act, and this Charter, an auditor holds office on the terms and conditions (including as to remuneration) that the Authority determines.
- 3.3.2 The Authority must provide its audited financial statements to the Chief Executive Officer of the Council by 30 September in each year.

Regulation 20 of the Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 2011, Auditor of subsidiary:

- (1) A Council subsidiary or regional subsidiary must have an auditor.
- (2) The auditor must be -
 - (a) A registered company auditor; or
 - (b) A firm comprising at least 1 registered company auditor.
- (3) A person is not eligible to be the auditor of a subsidiary if -
 - (a) The person is a member of the board of management of the subsidiary; or
 - (b) The person is a member of the council which established the subsidiary or, in the case of a regional subsidiary, a member of a constituent council; or

- (c) The person is a nominated candidate for election as a member of the council which established the subsidiary or, in the case of a regional subsidiary, is a nominated candidate for election as a member of a constituent council.
- (4) The office of auditor of a subsidiary becomes vacant if -
 - (a) The auditor dies; or
 - (b) The auditor resigns by written notice to the person who has been appointed to chair the board of management of the subsidiary; or
 - (c) The auditor is not or ceases to be eligible for appointment as the auditor; or
 - (d) The auditor accepts remunerated office or employment from the subsidiary or -
 - (i) In the case of a council subsidiary the council which established the subsidiary; or
 - (ii) In the case of a regional subsidiary a constituent council; or
 - (e) The term of appointment of the auditor expires and the auditor is not reappointed; or
 - (f) The auditor is removed from office by the subsidiary for reasonable cause.

The Authority must ensure the Auditor meets the requirements as detailed in *Regulation 20 (2) of the Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 2011.*

The external auditor will provide the Authority an opinion on Financial Statements and the internal financial controls to ensure the finances of the Authority provide a true and fair indication of the actual result and assist the Authority to meet their obligations under Clause 3.3.2 of the Charter.

It's appropriate for the Authority to seek approval from Council to utilise the services of Councils external Auditors for the 2018/19 financial year, with the view to reconsider the Authority's position to consider undertaking the recruitment process to appoint an Auditor for the 2019/20 financial year.

RISK ASSESSMENT

Risks associated with the recommendation have been assessed as follows:

Governance – The board will still meet the requirements of the Victor Harbor Tram Authority Charter for the Authority to appoint an Auditor. The risk is assessed as *low*.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

If the Authority decides to appoint Council's External Auditor or its own External Auditor, there will be additional, unbudgeted costs associated with the appointment.

The purpose of this report is to seek approval from the City of Victor Harbor to increase the Chairperson Remuneration fee.

RECOMMENDATION

- 1. That the Board receive and note the report on Independent Member Sitting Fee Chairperson.
- 2. That the Board seeks approval from the City of Victor Harbor to increase the Chairperson Remuneration sitting fee from \$3,000 per annum to \$5,000.

INFORMATION

At the Board meeting held on Thursday 4 April 2019, the Board resolved to appoint Paul Brown as Chair and Carol Schofield as Deputy Chair for the term of the Board as specified within Clause 2.5 of the Authorities Charter.

The remuneration fee for independent Members had been previously set by council at \$3,000 per annum which is paid quarterly in advance.

The Chair of the Authority receives the same amount as the Independent Board Members. The Chair has additional responsibilities, compared to other Board Members which include assisting the General Manager with the preparation of meeting agenda and attending to correspondence and media matters associated with the Authority as an example. It is considered appropriate the Chair receives a higher remuneration fee.

The Council is responsible for setting the remuneration of Independent Board Members. It is therefore, recommended that the Board seeks approval from Council to increase the capped remuneration fee of the Independent Member who has been appointed as the Chair of the Board from \$3000 to \$5000.

RISK ASSESSMENT

Risks associated with the recommendation have been assessed as follows:

Governance – The board will still meet the requirements of the Victor Harbor Tram Authority Charter for the Authority to pay appropriate remuneration fees to Board members. The risk is assessed as *low*.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

If the Authority decides to increase the Chairperson Remuneration sitting fee, there will be additional, unbudgeted costs associated with independent member sitting fees, however this can be managed with the current operating budget.

PURPOSE

The report seeks to provide the board with a number of options to consider with respect to future grazing land for the Horse Tram horses.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Victor Harbor Horse Tram Authority (VHHTA) write to the Chief Executive Officer of the City of Victor Harbor to seek approval to access the Council owned land outlined in Option 1 (known as Gillespie Land) as a short term grazing solution.

The VHHTA request that the General Manager commence negotiations with SA Water to access land identified as Options 2 & 3 and report back to the board.

INFORMATION

At the 4th April 2019 board meeting the board considered a report in relation to the future grazing options for the Clydesdale horses. Upon considering the report the board sought to be better informed about the options prior to making a final decision.

Council have been investigating a number of options for additional grazing land to support the horse tram Clydesdales over the last 12 months – these options are identified in **Attachment 1** with further commentary provided below.

Board members have recently participated in visits to the nominated sites.

In determining suitable land for grazing the following criteria was applied :

- Within a reasonable distance from the Horse Tram offices & barn
- Ease of access for horse tram vehicle and float
- Quality of pasture and or soil that would allow for pasture improvement
- Existing infrastructure and shade
- Terms of an arrangement including longevity

The options identified to date are as follows :

Option 1 (known as Gillespie Land): Council currently own land adjacent to the Canton Place paddock that borders Armstrong Road (Ring Road). The land is currently let to a private individual under a permit arrangement. The land is mostly sandy with soil and pasture improvements possibly required. Under the permit arrangement 28 days notice is required for Council to obtain access to the land. The land is earmarked by the Council for future sport and recreation purposes, on ground work is expected to occur in the next few of years. This is considered to be a short-term solution which can be accessed within the next three weeks. The horse tram currently own sufficient pipes, troughs and temporary electric fencing to activate this land.

<u>Footnote</u> : Flooding occurs through winter on existing paddock areas where the horses currently reside. An alternative site will be required for this winter, providing staff with options in the event of flooding.

Option 2: SA Water owned land directly adjacent to the existing paddock area on the corner of Canton Place, Henderson Road and Armstrong Road (Ring Road). It is understood that SA Water intend to install solar panels on much of this site in the future.

Council have requested advice from SA Water on their intentions for this land and their willingness to lease the whole or part thereof. No response has been received at the time of writing.

From previous conversations with representative from SA Water it is understood that commercial rates will be sought.

It is understood that treatment plant waste has been placed on the site previously. It will be prudent to undertake further investigations, to reduce any associated risks.

Option 3: SA Water owned land located on the corner of Martha Place and Canterbury Road on the opposite site of the Ring Road to the existing paddock area. It is understood that a portion of this site was used previously as a casual dump site. It is unknown as to the extent and nature of items dumped in this location. This land is accessible to the existing Canton Place stables, via a path under the Ring Road.

Option 4: That the Authority call for expressions of interest for the agistment of land in the local area under a commercial arrangement.

RISK ASSESSMENT

There is a public relations risk relating to the content of this report. The paddock and grazing area at the existing Canton Place site is limited, with minimal grass for grazing the public might form a view that the horses are not being well cared for by the Authority. Work undertaken by the Authority to determine and implement a solution will eliminate this risk.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

There are no budget implications associated with the recommendation.

PURPOSE

This report outlines a proposal to hold a small event to celebrate the recommencement of the Horse Tram services.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Victor Harbor Horse Tram Authority note plans to hold a celebratory event on the 23 June 2019 to raise the awareness of tram services recommencing.

INFORMATION

The Horse Tram Services have been disrupted for over five months since New Year's Day 2019. The Department of Planning Transport & Infrastructure have undertaken repair works during this period. Recent advice and testing suggests that the tram service will be able to recommence shortly.

Holding an event to celebrate the re-commencement of tram services provides an opportunity for the tram to market itself to the community and visitors to our region.

The event is scheduled to be held on Sunday 23rd June, starting with a VIP first tram with relevant Ministers, Federal and State Government dignitaries, Elected Members and other key stakeholders. Media will be invited, with an aim of gaining exposure on major evening news channels. VIP guests would travel to Granite Island where they'll enjoy morning tea at the Island Café before returning to the main land.

In conjunction with the VIP Tram activities, family friendly activities and activations will take place around the Causeway and foreshore precinct to create a festive environment with live musicians, roving performers, additional public seating and festive decorations around the site.

Optus have generously offered to provide and operate one of their TV screen trucks at the event, which would be used to promote historical imagery and video footage of the Horse Tram throughout the day.

A copy of the event flyer can be referred to as **Attachment 1**.

Staff will engage with existing Causeway business operators to become involved with the event, and help promote the event through their own promotional channels.

Given the likelihood for rain at this time of year is high, wet weather provisions will be factored in to the event planning.

A budget of \$4,000 is recommended to facilitate on ground activities including morning tea for up to 40 VIP guests on Granite Island, musicians and roving performers, site decorations and marquees along with marketing activities for the event.

RISK ASSESSMENT

Council's risk assessment tools will be applied during the planning phase of the event, highlighting likely risk and mitigating strategies.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

A budget of \$4,000 expenditure would be drawn from the existing Horse Tram operating budget 2018/19.
