INFORMATION

Purpose

The purpose of this report is to provide the Board with an update on progress against the Work Program for the Victor Harbor Horse Tram and consolidate the remaining items into a review of the VHHTA Business Plan 2019-21.

Background

In late 2018, the Victor Harbor Horse Tram Authority Board established a work program to help progress operations of the new Authority in a planned and considered manner. The work program spans the period November 2018 – October 2020. The actions listed have been determined largely from the Charter and in consideration of the work required in the first six (6) months to establish the Authority and operations at the Victor Harbor Horse Tram.

Workshops, out-of-session feedback to the General Manager from Board members, and special meetings are utilised to progress action in relation to the work plan in a timely manner and meet key deadlines.

This work program is subject to review, additions, deletions and amendments, and remains a live document. For this reason, a regular report is provided to the Board to highlight progress against the actions. The work program is maintained by the General Manager and timelines adjusted according to need and circumstances, providing Board members with an accurate and up-to-date report on progress and future expectations.

Commentary

Progress against the work program is tracking well, with most items completed to end of November 2019.

In order to streamline reporting of Authority direction, it is recommended that this be the final works program update report, and that future reporting to the Board be in relation to progress against the current business plan.

The Board would then need to endorse any changes for them to be formally included in the VHHTA business plan, noting that this can occur at any time outside of the required annual review of the Plan, in accordance with the VHHTA Charter.

INFORMATION

Purpose

To provide a consolidated list of achievements made during the first six months of the Authority under the new General Manager.

Commentary

The following are a list of achievements of the Victor Harbor Horse Tram Authority for the six month period since the commencement of the new General Manager.

Staff

- General Manager spent time with staff members on the ground learning their roles from the ground up. This includes working in the paddocks, with the horses and staff.
- This knowledge has also provided the GM with opportunities for improvements in processes and savings on staff wages.
- Horse Husbandry position filled with a shared position of two part-time staff members.
- New Tram operator started in August 2019 ready for the busy summer months.
- Roster changes which engage volunteers with the paddock clean up to save wages and trial the junior role.
- Trialing the second staff member / volunteer travelling on the tram as a safety measure.
- Timetable adjustments to reflect service demand and save wages
- Enterprise Bargaining Agreement written, negotiated, and currently out to staff for their vote.
- Junior Role being developed to encourage younger staff to get involved with the tram and start their journey as a potential Tram operator in the future. This also acts as a wage cost reduction going forward.
- Monthly staff meetings are in place.
- Open communication with Staff so as to understand their needs, operational requirements and taking on board their expertise in the industry

Giving the Coordinator some well-deserved leave.

Volunteers

- Volunteer registrar is being developed.
- Volunteer policy and Job descriptions being developed with Board member, Natasha Hunt's help.
- Three new volunteers are being started, this will see help with maintenance and tram operations as they are trained.
- Police checks will be introduced for all Volunteers and Staff over the next 2 months.

Marketing

- Back on Track event Advertising in The Times, Coast Lines, The Advertiser.
- Horses Birthday in August Celebrated with a horse birthday cake, trialed the Kids Ride Free promotion. Story was covered by the Advertiser and The times.
- Ticket price change Kids ride free, Adult price increase and the introduction of concession/student pricing, providing a great promotional opportunity with signage and customer word of mouth.
- Meeting held with SATC and the Chair, Paul Brown, Board Member Rachel Kennedy and General Manager to work towards promotional opportunities that the VHHTA can be involved with.
- Numerous radio interviews and local TV interviews, as well as a presentation to a local community group
- Featured on South Aussie with Cosi with our Learner trainee Clydesdale, "Scotty"

Horses

- Purchase of a new horse Chester, 8 year old Brother to Izzabella
- Training schedule developed with the new Horse Husbandry position in place. Including cross-training and strengthening.
- Grazing Land access at Gillespie tidy up and spray schedule for fence lines put in place.
- Fencing of Gillespie land to keep horses away from the exterior fence line that is along the side of the walking trail.
- Liaison with Council staff in relation to the potential land purchase around Canton place for extra grazing land options.
- Scotty's training is now well underway, including successful tram training.
- Change of Farrier to keep costs from escalating old farrier's price went up \$50 per horse.
- Management of ongoing horse health issues requiring vet visits and procedures.

Trams

- Brakes on all trams are set up now so they can be accessed easily when repairs are needed.
- Brakes of all trams are in the process of having nuts and rods replaced.
- Tram no. 3 has had new wheels which has then led to new bearings and alignment.
- Tram no. 2 is getting new bearings at the moment.
- Tram no. 1 is scheduled to have its bearings replaced.

Maintenance schedules are being developed for the trams going forward so as to maintain tram operational functionality as well as their outer appearance.

Tram office

- Window replaced with one that opens to the public as a point of sale.
-) Spinning feed turn-style in the middle of the tram store room has been removed allowing significantly more room for equipment and storage cupboards.
- Water delivery from Neverfail spring water has been cancelled and replaced with at Pura Tap water supply for the staff as a more cost-effective means of supplying staff with drinking water.
- New fire extinguisher supplier for tram office, trams, ute and stabling areas.
- Sign replacement at the front of the office to indicate the ticket sales area and pricing.
- New clocks purchased and installed for the tram times.
- Design and installation of sign with pictures of the horses that are working that day. (This also acts as an area to indicate closures due to high winds or heat.)
- Board and staff meetings are being held at the tram office to save funds on room hire costs.
- In-house catering for different events for staff and Board to save funds.
- The financials and payroll have transitioned over from Council to the Authority, with responsibilities undertaken by the GM with support from accountant SMPCA.

Stable improvements

- Plans drawn up for the potential new Stabling facilities at Canton place.
-) Plans drawn up for the new platform over on Granite Island (current one very rusty).

INFORMATION

Purpose

The purpose of this report is to present the draft sponsorship packages of the Victor Harbor Horse Tram Authority (VHHTA) to the Board for endorsement.

Background

The Board identified a need to develop a sponsorship package for the VHHTA and included it within their work plan. A need was also identified by the previous Horse Drawn Tram Committee, who recognized in their report of September 2017, the need to attract sponsorship dollars to reduce the financial impact of the Horse Tram operation on Council ratepayers. The Board already has an endorsed Sponsorship Policy and this sits above the draft sponsorship package as the guiding policy document.

Nigel Catt was assigned leadership of this task and has prepared a suite of sponsorship package documents for endorsement by the Board.

Commentary

The Board have had several discussions to guide the development of the sponsorship package.

The packages are attached to this report, and are summarised below.

The General Manager of the Victor Harbor Horse Tram Authority is provided with the delegated authority to implement the Sponsorship Policy already endorsed by the Board and utilise the sponsorship packages to support this work. It should be recognised that there is a need for the General Manager to have some flexibility to be able to tailor sponsorship packages to individual circumstances, and it is recommended that the Board give some ability for this to occur without the need for a further Board resolution, providing that changes are in line with the endorsed Sponsorship Policy.

Discussions are ongoing in relation to increasing the VHHTA's own-source revenue. Endorsement of these packages is vital to enable the Authority to seek sponsors in a timely manner over what is the busiest period of the year for Horse Tram service.

RISK ASSESSMENT

The following risks have been assessed in line with Council's Risk Management Framework and Policy:

Financial Management - The sponsorship packages are currently not included in the 2019/20 budget. There has been no target set for this current financial year, but any sponsorship will improve the own source revenue of the Authority. This risk is assessed as *low*.

If a sponsorship package is taken up by a company and the Authority fails to deliver the package inclusions there would be an effect on the bottom line. This risk is assessed as **medium**.

Socio Political, Community issues/Reputation – The development of a sponsorship package facilitates the ability of the Authority to enter into sponsorship arrangements which will go some way to increasing own-source revenue and reducing reliance on Council rates revenue. This is likely to be supported by the community and develop mutually beneficial arrangements between the Horse Tram and local businesses. This risk is assessed as *low*.

Corporate Governance - The Authority under its Sponsorship Policy can enter into sponsorship arrangements to increase own source funding. This sponsorship package facilitates this process. This has been assessed as *low*.



1894: The First Horse Drawn Tram Passenger Service

For many year's goods were conveyed between the mainland and the island on railway trucks drawn by horses. Many visitors to Victor Harbor delighted in the walk across the Causeway to the island. As it had become a local attraction, and the rail line already existed, the South Australian Railways (SAR) decided to utilise one of the their unused horse-drawn passenger trams to offer a service to the island. On 27 December 1894 the passenger horse tramway was established.

The First Island Tram – No. 7


The first tram to be used on the Causeway was a six-windowed double ended, double deck car built in England by "Brown Marshall" of Birmingham. It had originally been delivered to the Goolwa Railway in 1879, then transferred to the Moonta Horse Railway in 1887, then stored at the SAR's Islington workshop from 1891 until it was sent to Victor Harbor in 1894. Car No. 7 continued in service until 1931.

The Second Island Tram - No. 25

The passenger horse trams in Adelaide were gradually replaced by electric trams from 1909 onwards. Tram No. 25 was purchased from the Municipal Tramways Trust (MTT) and transferred to Victor Harbor to support No. 7 in service to the island. It was built by Adelaide and Suburban Tramway company around 1900/ It was converted from standard tramway gauge (1435mm) to railway broad gauge (1600mm) by mounting axle boxes to a wooden unperformed which protruded from the sides of the body panels. No. 25 joined No. 7 in 1910 until its retirement in 1929.



No. 5 departs the Victor Harbor terminus.

1931: Trams No. 5 & No. 6


When the Moonta Tramways closed in 1931 the two trams of best condition were towed by a railway line inspection car to the Islington Workshop for overhaul. They were standard SAR six-windowed 'American' type double ended, double-deck broad gauge horse trams. The wheel bases were imported from John Stevenson of New York, U.S.A. and they were built by Duncan & Frazer of Adelaide in 1883. Both continued in service until the mid 1950's.

1900-1954: The Honeyman Brothers

George Honeyman operated the service, under a contract with SAR, from the beginning of the 1900s until 1940 when his younger brother Frank took over and operated t until closure in 1955. The horses were kept in stables on Seymour lane and walked to the trams, which were parked on a siding behind the Station Master's house. The cars were parked in the open and exposed to the elements. When an extra long railway train was in town the cars were even parked on the Causeway. So, every two years they were towed to Islington for overhaul during winter.



The biggest steam locomotive built in the UK, Engine 505 dwarfs No. 5.



Early 1950s No. 5 heads back to mainland at speed.

During the early 1950s Frank Honeyman and Mayor William Jenkins had a number of differences about the operation of the tramway. The old Working Jetty and the remnants of the Victoria Per were being demolished by the Harbour's Board. At the time essential repairs to the Causeway were decided upon, but to strengthen the Causeway for continued operation of the tramway required an additional expenditure of 3,000 pounds.

Frank Honeyman stabled the horses for the last time in June 1954 and then retired. The Council offered the service at tender but there was no interest. The Causeway was reconstructed without rails and the Horse Drawn Tramway came to an end.

Tram No. 5 continued to operate on the remaining Granite Island tracks through the summer of 1955-56, under the ownership of the proprietor of the kiosk. It was finally put on static display, at the approach to the Screwpile Jetty, where it remained until the weather and vandals reduced it to a public danger. Sadly, it was disposed of by being pushed off the edge into the sea!

Tram No. 6 was purchased by Raymond Schmidt, an American who had ridden the tramway during the war years. In 1971 he found it on display at a service station in Auburn. It is now restored as a single deck and is featured in his museum in Connecticut, USA.


It is no wonder that the Victor Harbor Horse Drawn Tramway has become a significant South Australian icon and a fond memory of many visitors.

1980-1985: Reinstatement of the Horse Drawn Tram


1986 marked the 150th Jubilee of South Australia. Plans for special projects, events and celebrations wee being laid in the early 80s through the establishment of a Jubilee 150 Board.

John Drennan, State Transport Authority (STA) Public Relations Officer, was one amongst many who felt that Victor Harbor did not seem the same to holiday-makers without the Horse Drawn Trams of old. He registered the tramway reinstatement as a Jubilee event and gained it official consideration. The victor Harbor Council were in favour, but not financially able to fund it alone. When Bob Barry succeeded as District Clerk and threw in his support other entities made significant contributions. The Jubilee 150 Board allocated \$50,000, the Commonwealth Employment Program supplied \$150,000 for labour and materials, Australia National (Railways) came forward with secondhand railway lines and spoked wheels for the trams, and the Victor Harbor Council was able to allocate \$200,000. The Department of Marine and Harbours spent \$170,000 upgrading the Causeway to a safe standard.


The Trams



Coach builders no longer existed, which posed a dilemma. Basic line illustrations and photographs of trams from the same era as No. 7 and No. 25 formed the basis of a new design. The new trams would be made of tubular steel with timber cladding and use roller bearings in custom axle boxes. They would also accommodate 50 adults as opposed to 32 on the old trams.




The project began in February 1986 with two teams of ten people. One team built the four new trams at Port Adelaide, while the other team laid the truck and constructed the stables, fencing and an enclosure at Victor Harbor.

Mirko Crafts were contracted to do the carpentry work and according to Kim Bayly, who did the paintwork on all four trams, praised 'Mirko', the owner of the business, as a true craftsman. Three-pack automotive paints were used to counter the harsh marine environment that the trams would be subject to during service.

The paint work on the first tram, No. 1, was completed over 3 weeks in the Goods Shed in Victor Harbor. This is the current location of the SA Whale Centre. Tram No. 2 arrived only a week before the scheduled grand opening. Trams No. 3 and No. 4 arrived later in the year, but No. 1 and No. 2 were fully prepared for the big day, 14 June 1986.

Subject Reallocation of Capital Funds to Support Construction of Stable

Facilities at Canton Place

RECOMMENDATION

 That the Victor Harbor Horse Tram Authority receive and note the Reallocation of Capital Funds to Support Construction of Stable Facilities at Canton Place report.

2. That the Victor Harbor Horse Tram Authority seek endorsement from City of Victor Harbor for the reallocation of funds from their capital budget as described in this report, to support the construction of improved stabling facilities based upon the draft design included at Attachment A, subject to Council acquiring a license to purchase the land or another form of legal agreement securing tenure at Canton Place.

INFORMATION

Purpose

The purpose of this report is to seek endorsement from the Board to recommend to Council a reallocation of capital funds to facilitate an upgrade of the stables at Canton Place, superceding the previous Board resolution, as a result of details now being release by DPTI regarding the realignment of the new causeway.

Background

The Stabling facilities at Canton place are below standard and need upgrading. This has long been recognised, and was highlighted in the September 2017 report of the Horse Drawn Tram Committee and has been discussed in some detail already by the current Board.

At the Board meeting of 20 August 2019, the Board resolved the following, with the understanding that a delay would be necessary before bringing the matter to Council, pending determination by DPTI regarding the alignment of the new Causeway:

VHHTA103 - That the Victor Harbor Horse Tram Authority seek endorsement from the City of Victor Harbor to reallocate capital funds in their 19/20 capital budget to support an upgrade to the stables at Canton Place, facilitated by a scope reduction for the merchandise area redevelopment.

DPTI have now announced that the new causeway will be realigned and this will be likely to impact on the future location of the Horse Tram Office, rendering even a merchandise area scope reduction now redundant. The recent installation of a ticket window at the office, a low budget solution to achieve a similar outcome, will allow for more effective customer servicing until the future location of the Tram Office is determined. For this reason, further consideration and endorsement of a new way forward should be is required by the Board as the resolution described above in VHHTA103 is now obsolete.

Council is currently negotiating the purchase of the Canton Place land with SA Water. The ability to develop stables on this land will be subject to their signing of a license to purchase this land or another form of legal agreement securing tenure.

Commentary

A new stable facility would enable the Victor Harbor Horse Tram Authority (VHHTA) to develop opportunities around VIP experiences, educational programs and incorporate new amenities for the staff and public. These were opportunities first identified by the former Horse Drawn Tram Committee and which have been further considered by the current VHHHTA Board. The opportunity to produce these programs from a redeveloped stabling facility to showcase the horses and their training would facilitate the building of own-source revenue by the VHHHTA and go some way towards reducing its reliance on council funded revenue.

With the uncertainty of the location of the Tram Office building in future due to the construction of a new Causeway at a different alignment the current Causeway, it would be an imprudent use of funds to expend capital monies on significant improvements to the Tram Office at this stage.

A revised proposal and recommended reallocation of funds to improve stabling facilities is detailed as follows:

Council's Capital Budget allocation for the redevelopment of the merchandise area was \$50,000.

Council's Capital budget also allocated \$20,600 to relocate a portable office building from Council's Depot to Canton place for use by Horse Tram staff. Reallocating the \$20,600 would enable the Authority to construct the stable building this financial year, a project which would not be impacted by the future alignment of the causeway.

The completion of the fit-out of the stables interior and staff amenities is included in the budget bids for 2020/21 as endorsed by the Board by Circular Resolution for consideration by Council in their budget deliberations.

There are also funds allocated in Council's 2019/20 capital budget for new linoleum flooring in the Tram office which will no longer be required in 2019/20, with current uncertainty around the future office location as a result of the realignment of the new causeway.

The replacement of the roller door at the tram office would also no longer be a current priority for this reason.

The capital funds allocated by Council to the fencing at the Gillespie land has \$5,000 remaining which could also be reallocated towards the stable facility construction.

In consultation with Horse Tram staff, a draft design has been developed for improvements to the stable facilities at Canton Place and is provided at Attachment A. Plans have been drawn up by Barefoot Design with quotes obtained for the shed structure as part one to this project. The proposed design includes positioning the stable in the first fenced area at Canton place, closest to the Ring Road. Part two of the stabling fit out is included as a Board endorsed budget bid to Council for 2020/21. The design facilitates stabling for four horses on the uphill side, with outside yarding attached. It also includes a storage area for the ute and float in the middle drive through section. One end corner is a room for a presentation area /staff use and amenities. A wash down area and tie up area is proposed to be located on the downhill side of the shed.

RISK ASSESSMENT

The risks associated with the recommendation have been assessed as follows:

Financial Management – The capital funds are available in City of Victor Harbor's capital budget and had been allocated for the purposes of projects relevant to the horse tram. This proposal does not require additional capital funds in this financial year and is simply a reallocation to facilitate modified capital works. The risk is assessed as *low*.

Socio Political, Community Issues / Reputation – This proposal will upgrade the stable facilities which will likely go some way to appease community with concerns about the condition of the current stabling facilities. The risk is assessed as *low*.

There may be some reputational risk from a further delay to improving stabling facilities, which may result from Council not supporting the development or from delays in securing tenure or ownership of the land. The risk is assessed as **medium**.

There may be some concern from Council and the community that planned improvements to the horse tram office are being delayed, however with DPTI recently announcing a realignment of the new causeway, it would be prudent to expend money only on projects where there is future certainly. The risk is assessed as **medium**.

Employee Safety/ Public Safety - The proposal will still address Work Health & Safety requirements for employee amenities at the stabling facility. The risk is assessed as *low*.

Infrastructure and Assets – There is a risk of this project not proceeding if ownership or tenure of the land is not secured by Council. If this is the case, the project would not be able to proceed until this matter is resolved. The risk is assessed as **low**.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

The budget implications associated with the recommendation are relevant to City of Victor Harbor, rather than the Horse Tram Authority as they are Capital budget items held by Council that are proposed to be modified. The proposal does not require additional capital funds this financial year, but rather a reallocation to support upgrade of the stabling facilities. The fit out of the stables will be presented as a budget bid for 2020/21.

As this proposal would change the capital budget allocation which has been endorsed by Council for the merchandise area development, replacement flooring and roller door replacement, toilet / Amenities from Depot and part of fencing funds. Council endorsement would need to be sought to reallocate capital funds to support this proposal.

Subject First Quarter Financial Report 2019/20 – Profit and Loss Statement

RECOMMENDATION

That the Victor Harbor Horse Tram Authority receive and note the First Quarter Financial Report 2019/20 – Profit and Loss Statement report and provide it to Council for their information.

INFORMATION

Purpose

The purpose of this report is to provide the Board with the profit and loss statement for the first quarter of 2019/20.

Background

The General Manager (GM) has appointed the Accounting firm SMPCA to assist with the financials of the VHHTA and is using the XERO accounting software to manage the VHHTA financials in-house. The GM has been working with Council finance staff to transfer over all financials from City of Victor Harbor to the Victor Harbor Horse Tram Authority's control. This has resulted in a delay of presenting the financials for the first quarter of 2019/20 to the Board.

Commentary

Re-opening of the Tram in June 2019, has put us back on track. The first quarter is showing figures above expectations based on previous years, partly due to changes in ticket pricing, which has been well received by the public. The first quarter 2019/20 Profit and Loss Statement is provided at Attachment A.

RISK ASSESSMENT

The risks associated with the recommendation have been assessed as follows:

Financial Management – The VHHTA is on track to achieve and end of financial year position in accordance with the adopted budget, with forecasted income expected to peak over the coming few months during holiday season. The Board are continuing to find ways to generate own-source income outside of ticket sales to improve the bottom line into the future. There is also likely to be a further improvement in future quarters due to a ticket price increase in October 2019. The risk is assessed as *low*.

Socio Political, Community Issues / Reputation – The first quarter of the 2019/20 financial year occurs over months of poor weather that are not traditionally high income yielding quarters for the Horse Tram. This has also been a particularly challenging time of the Horse Tram with frequent closures of the causeway due to inclement weather. Persons reviewing the statements without an understanding that the highest yield service period is yet to come might misunderstand the position of the Authority at this point in the year. This statement was due within 30 days of the end of quarter, however delays resulting from challenges with transferring financial data from the Council to the Authority resulted in a period of delay. The risk is assessed as *medium*.
